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I . PROGRAM OVERVIEW

■ **Program Title:** KOICA-KNUE Master's Degree Program in Global Education Leadership

■ **Duration**

- Stay duration: August 1, 2022 ~ December 25, 2023 (17 months)

During the 17 months at KNUE university, students are strongly advised to complete their thesis.

- Academic Duration: August 1, 2022 ~ February 20, 2024 (19 months)

In accordance with university regulations, the diploma will be issued on 22 February 2024.

■ **Degree: Master of Education (M. Ed.)**

■ **Objective:** The Master's Program in Global Leadership in Education at KNUE aims to empower educational leaders of developing countries who have a strong understanding of educational policy development and its influence on educational practices with a global network that can be used in developing effective policies for their home countries and ultimately help them contribute to global education. The program covers curricula on Educational Policy for the Future and Teacher Competency Development.

■ **Training Institute:** The program is offered by the Graduate School of Korea National University of Education (KNUE) (<http://en.knue.ac.kr/>). Currently, about 3,200 students are enrolled in the Graduate School of KNUE. Most of them are current teachers and school administrators.

■ **Number of Participants: 15 Participants**

■ **Language Requirements**

All courses are taught in English and the thesis is to be written in English. In order to facilitate field experience, applicants are required to learn Korean. Korean language and culture classes will be provided.

■ **Accommodation**

Dormitory 'Eulim'(어울림) is the residence hall on campus. Bedrooms for single occupancy will be provided. *Students are to bring their own bedding

■ How to Apply

■ Application Eligibility

The following conditions should be met.

Applicants should

- hold the nationality of a KOICA partner country.
- receive official nomination from the government of the recipient country
- be public officials or public sector workers
(Public sector workers are those who are currently working in government-run institutions such as state-owned enterprises/banks/research centers/teachers at national and public schools.)
- hold a bachelor's degree officially recognized by the government of the host country
- have sufficient English proficiency to take classes in English and write a thesis
- have never received support for a master's degree program from the Korean government
- have never been expelled from a KOICA supported degree program due to submission of false documents, underachieving grades, or violation of school regulations

A total of 15 applicants will be accepted this year. For each country, only two applicants will be admitted in the same year. Gender distribution will be considered for admission decisions. Applicants to the M. Ed. program must possess relevant experience in education because this major is practitioner-based.

■ Admission Process

The admission process consists of four parts:

- (1) All application documents are reviewed for their completeness.
- (2) The Degree Program Committee at KNUE evaluates the application documents. After the initial screening through document review, online interviews are set up and administered.
- (3) The Admission Fairness Committee reviews the fairness of the evaluation.
- (4) KNUE Graduate School Committee officially approves the admission decision.

Evaluation criteria are the following:

- Academic Readiness: Applicant's academic readiness for the program is evaluated. The transcript of the applicant should demonstrate proper prerequisite courses for the program. The plan of study should demonstrate proper knowledge and skills.

- Academic Aptitude: Applicant's academic aptitude will be determined by the applicant's GPA. An overall GPA of a minimum 3.0/4.0 is required.
- Academic Motivation: The plan of study should demonstrate proper motivation for pursuing the degree program. A record of persistent study habits will be looked for.

1) KNUE Orientation (On the day of arrival)

- There is an orientation for introduction of course outline, general information about KNUE, overview of the scholarship program and useful information on living in Korea
- When conditions permitted, there will be a campus tour and/or welcome dinner with program faculty.














2) Pre-course work

- A 3-week basic Korean classes will be provided. In case of obligatory quarantine due to the impact of COVID-19, as may be required by the Korean government, the class schedule and mode of instruction may be adjusted.

- Class Duration: 15 weeks on regular semesters & 3 weeks (15 days) long on winter semester (2nd Semester)
- Mid-term exam: in the 7th week of each semester
- Final exam: in the 15th week of each semester
- **Grade Report: received 2 weeks after completion of each semester**
- Others:
 - Living in Eulim Dormitory is mandatory
 - Course meetings for Thesis Research Seminar vary depending on the thesis advisor.
 - A thesis advisor will be decided after the second (winter) semester.
 - Class meetings scheduled on holidays will be made up.
 - Students with absences of over 1/4 of classes will be automatically given an F grade.
 - All other rules will follow KNUE regulations.

2) Graduation Requirements

- In order to graduate, students must complete 30 credits, earn a GPA higher than 3.0 (higher than B), and submit a thesis through the Thesis Research course.

3. EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES (TENTATIVE)

During semesters and breaks, there will be programs for field experience, cultural experience, and Korean language learning. There could be restrictions on field experience due to the impact of COVID-19. In such cases, these activities could be canceled or modified as online experiences.

Exemplary programs are as follows:

- Networking with educational institution officials: twice per semester (April, June, October, and December) with educational officials (masters or doctoral students) at the Graduate School of Educational Policy and Administration in KNUE
- Meetings with current teachers: 4 times per semester with current teachers (masters or doctoral students) at the Graduate School of Education in KNUE
- Seminars and forums: twice per semester (March, May, September, and November) among program participants (international governmental officials)
- Cultural excursions: during every break to experience Korean culture, at Seoul Metropolitan City, Jeonju Traditional House (Han-ok), and others. (Visiting venues subject to change)

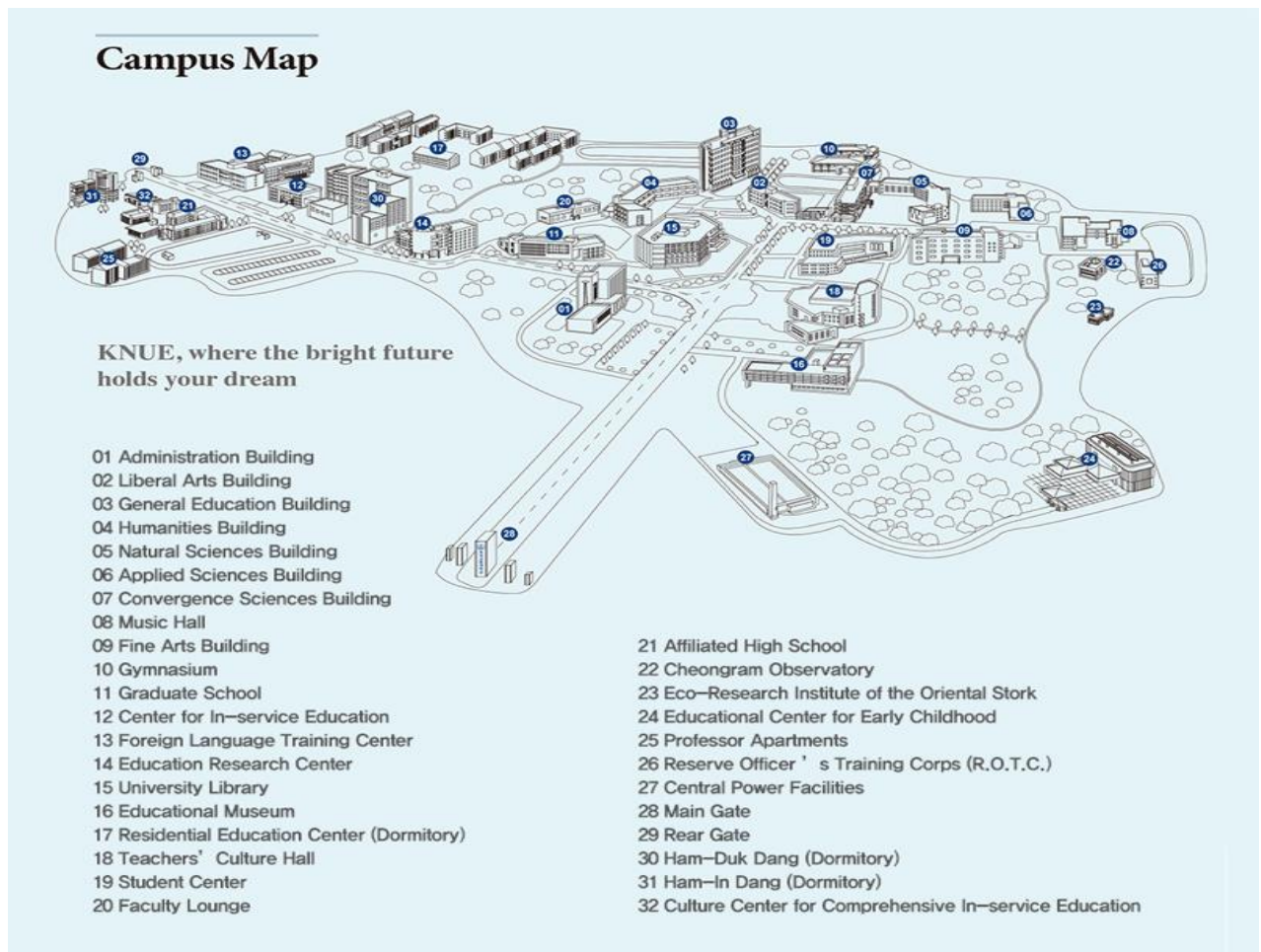
1. GENERAL INFORMATION

1) About the University

❑ Korea National University of Education (KNUE)

Korea National University of Education (KNUE) is the only specialized comprehensive teacher education university in Korea that fulfills its three main objectives: leading education for future generations through comprehensive education of teachers in kindergarten, elementary schools, and secondary schools, continually training current teachers and researching about the theories and practices of education

KNUE runs a residential, educational program to let the students realize the true values of love, confidence, and patience. The future teacher, through living closely by the residential education program, will become an educational leader of great compassion, service, consideration, elegance, morals, self-motivation, cooperation, understanding and tolerance.

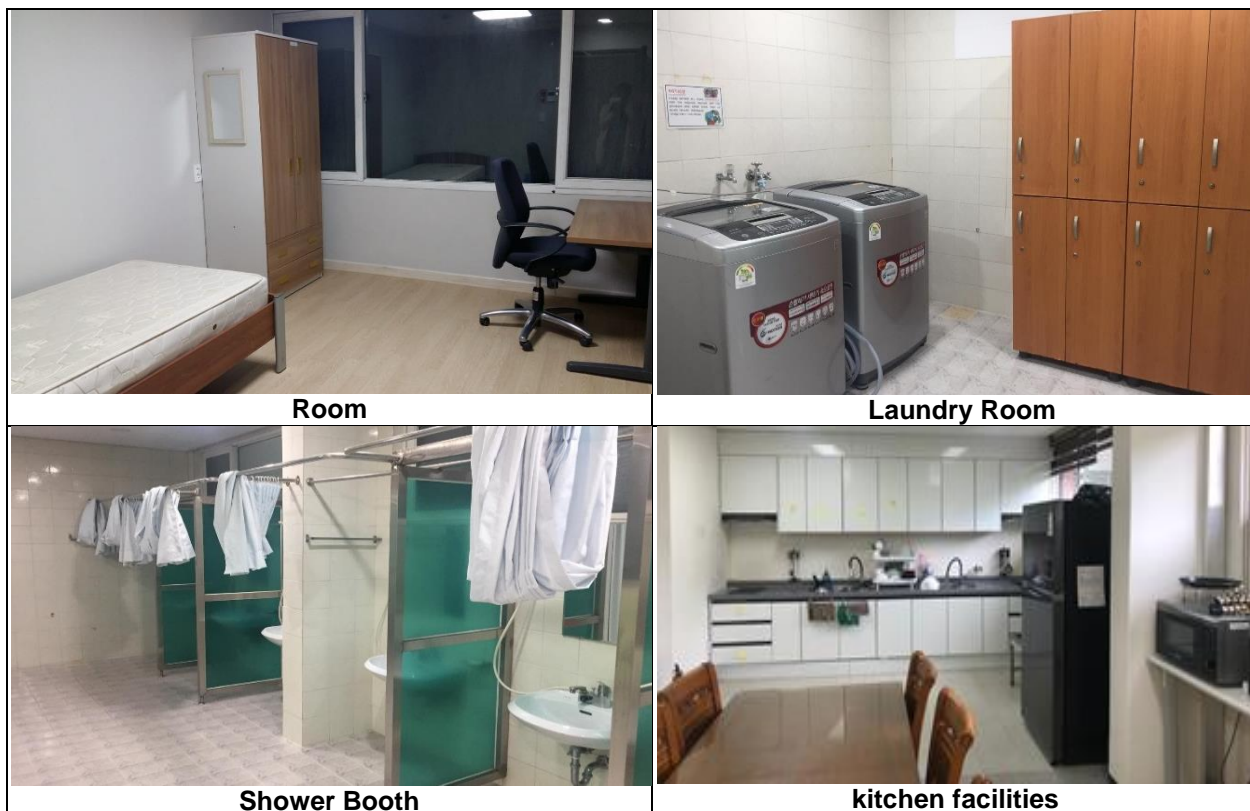

2. ACCOMMODATION

❑ 'Eulim' Building (Dormitory)

The Residential Education Center is a unique central facility that instills liberal education, educational leadership, self-development, and a basic teaching attitude in all students, which are required for future teachers. The Residential Education Center operates an independent student education program that consists of direct and indirect education in daily life through the school's unique blend of educational training and makes efforts to train teachers through various volunteering and personality programs, experiential education, and consultations.

As the only Residential College in Korea for teacher education, the Residential Education Center is composed of 10 dormitory buildings housing more than a thousand rooms (capacity: more than 2,000 individuals). One dormitory building has been remodeled for the KOICA-KNUE program. The participants will be provided with an individual bedroom on campus. Students are required to bring their own bedding (blankets and pillows).

■ Graduate School

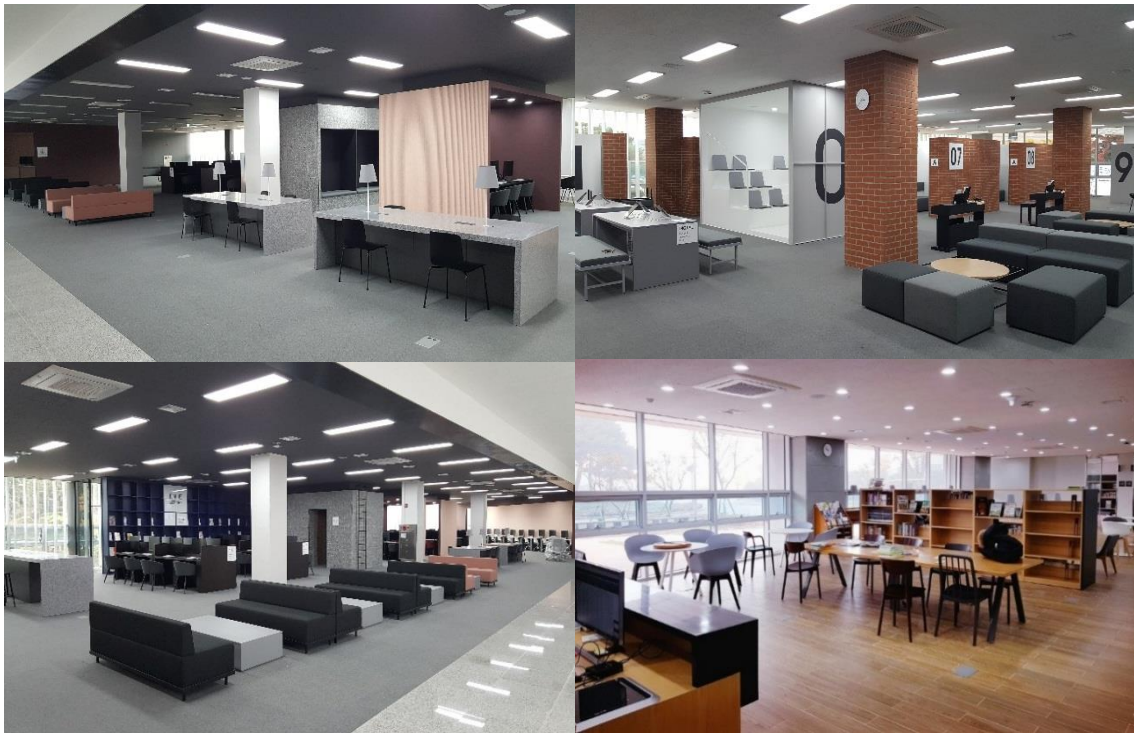
The Graduate School of KNUE consists of the Graduate School of Education and the Graduate School of Educational Policy and Administration. The former covers regular masters and doctoral programs while the latter covers master's programs for in-service teachers. The Graduate School's master's program includes in-service teacher's re-education (Special Admission Program) and its doctoral courses are designed specifically to develop future university professors and/or education organization specialists. The goal of the Graduate School of Education is to raise the level of school education via re-education of in-service teachers to yield outstanding teachers of talent. KNUE's Graduate School of Educational Policy and Administration is the only graduate school in Korea specializing in education policy. It aims to train education policy experts with education policy planning and

analytical skills to lead the 21st century. The master's degree program offers focused training for an education specialist in the Ministry of Education and municipal and provincial education offices.



■ Library

Acting as an academic information center for the study and research of faculty, students and trainees, the four-story library accommodates around 1,200 reading seats and a collection of over 500,000 books. The library is brand new with state-of-the-art facilities, composed of three open reading rooms and three materials rooms. The 1st materials room contains general books; the 2nd materials room contains bounded journals, magazines, and general theses. The educational collection room contains textbooks, teacher's guides, general education books, references, and periodicals. The Reference and Serial collection room consists of various references, serials, and theses for a degree. The library established an internet-based computerized catalog where people can download materials related to education and course lectures, published dissertations and other materials pertaining to the university and research materials unveiled domestically and overseas.



■ Center for In-service Education

The center for In-service Education focuses mainly on teacher training, which is one of the three main functions of the Korea National University of Education. It operates and develops creative training courses and methods, and acts as a national-level comprehensive education training center, presenting and spreading national educational policies to the education field, effectively unifying education in the nation. It is also an advanced training center that

incorporates both research and training functions by applying the research and development of unique and specialized training programs into the training courses and serves as the center of Korea's teacher training.

■ Education Research Institute

The Education Research Institute is in charge of educational research, one of the three main objectives of KNUE. It aims to contribute to the qualitative improvement of education in Korea through comprehensive and systematic research on basic education theory and school subject education and teacher education. The Center for Teaching and Learning, which was established in the Education Research Institute in 2009, invites different academic luminaries to take part in forums and workshops for professors and students aimed at improving teaching and learning skills. It also provides various support for teaching and learning facilities, such as class action analysis rooms where classes can be recorded and analyzed, mock classrooms and other various education media production facilities.

■ Education Center for Early Childhood

The Education Center for Early Childhood was established in 2012 to develop research on early childhood education and support high-quality practices of early childhood education out in the field, implementing early childhood education that is appropriate for the future. In 2015, it was selected as the college research institute of humanities and social sciences for promoting various research projects. It provides an opportunity for the children to experience nature through the environmental education program centered around endangered animals, educates the parents on early childhood education and parent education and trains the teachers with customized programs that support early childhood education research and education practice. The Education Center for Early Childhood provides a new paradigm for the future of early childhood education.

Educational Museum

❑ Educational Museum

Founded in 1987, KNUE Museum was reborn as the Educational Museum in 2010. The Educational Museum has 7,400 m² of space in six exhibition halls and has a collection of about 30,000 items, including educational and historical materials. The Educational Museum has contributed to educational researches by collecting, preserving and displaying the educational materials and by studying the materials about the school's history. The Educational Museum is currently developing and operating the various programs on educational culture and Korean traditional culture. The Educational Museum will help KNUE become the center of Korean education in the 21st century by helping KNUE fulfill three educational objectives: the cultivation of future teachers, in-service teacher training, and educational research. Also, the Educational Museum is to become a landmark of the history of Korean education, the spot of educational research and the space of experience and participation.

❑ Eco-Research Institute of the Oriental Stork

The Eco-Research Institute of the Oriental Stork was established in 1996 to restore the oriental stork, which was last seen in 1994 in Korea. The institute researched on the naturalization of the oriental stork and the effects of migrating oriental storks with Russia, China, and Japan, countries where the oriental stork naturally inhabits. In 1996, it has received four oriental storks from Germany and Russia, and after years of successful breeding, the institute now has 97 oriental storks. In September 2015, it released 8 oriental storks at Ye-san Stork Park, an unprecedented event in Korean history. 7 of those released are still living promotions to improve the environmental awareness of the people. It runs an oriental stork habitat education program where the visitors can freely observe and feed the oriental storks in the Cheongnam Oriental Stork Park located inside the university.

IV. ACADEMIC REGULATIONS

1. ATTENDANCE AND ABSENTEEISM

Students are expected to attend all of the classes he/she has registered for each semester. Any student who, without a good reason, has failed to attend a class for at least two-thirds of the total class hours shall be prohibited from sitting for an exam.

In the event that a student is absent for any of the reasons below, he/she must notify the appropriate department, faculty, and dean and get approval in advance:

- Death of an immediate family member (grandparents, parents, siblings) or equivalent circumstance
- Academic planning, field-trips, on-location training, etc.
- Participation in seminars or conferences (including international ones) as approved by the Dean of Graduate School
- Other events approved by the Graduate School

In the event of student illness or emergency situations, students who will be absent for less than seven days (including holidays and weekends) need to submit written notification of such absence to the Graduate School Dean. For any term longer than seven days, students must submit a diagnosis written by physician.

2. MUST RESIDE IN KNUE RESIDENCE

- Students must reside in the KNUE Dormitory.
- Single occupancy
- Living off-campus is not allowed

3. MUST ABIDE BY RESIDENCY REGULATIONS

- KNUE has very strict residency regulations and all students must abide by them.
- A student who violates residency regulations will be evicted from the KOICA Resident House or KNUE Dormitory, and he/she must return to his/ her country immediately.

4. EXAMINATIONS AND GRADE EVALUATIONS

Minimum Grade Point Average Requirement

- Students must maintain a minimum of a B0 (80-84) grade point average. Anything below 80 points will not be acknowledged as a passing grade.

Regular Exams and Make-up Exams

- Regular Exams: Mid-term (7th to 8th week of the semester), Final (last two weeks of semester)
- Make-up Exams: In the event a student cannot sit for an exam due to illness or any other emergency, the student must notify the faculty before the test date, and obtain the Graduate School Dean's approval to sit for the exam at another time.

Qualifications to Sit for an Exam

Any student who, without good reason, has failed to attend a class for at least two-thirds of the total classes shall be prohibited from sitting for the exam. In the event of illnesses or emergencies, students need to provide a written explanation for their absence.

Scholastic Performance Evaluation Method

Scholastic performance will be based on a 100-point scale for each course registered. Grades will be based on classroom performance (presentations, attendance) and test performance (mid-term and final exams).

VI. PRECAUTIONS

- **Possibility of Online Program** : according to arising circumstances due to the spread of COVID-19 and public health regulations thereof, the academic program within this PI may be moved online; in accordance with academic regulations of each training institute, blended learning (or hybrid learning, a combination of online and face-to-face learning) may be implemented, pre-sessions included
 - In principle, even when the academic program is conducted online, participants must be physically present in Korea to participate (cannot participate in the program online from home country or outside Korea)
- **Early Departure** : due to various circumstances such as no operating flights or border closures, participants shall be required to depart Korea before the program end date
 - In such cases, part of the academic curriculum, thesis defense, or closing ceremony may be conducted online
- **Living Costs** : in principle, costs of living are provided per diem; that is, participants receive living costs per diem based on the actual date of departure
 - In case of early departure, living costs are received per diem based on the date of early departure, and NOT the anticipated departure date or program end date
- **COVID-19 Test Fees** : costs of COVID-19 testing required by quarantine regulations during the departure and arrival process are first incurred by the participant and later reimbursed via the Settlement Allowance and Scholarship Completion Grants
- **Adherence to Entry/Departure Guidelines** : any additional costs occurring due to the participant's failure to adhere to the entry/departure guidelines are the participant's own responsibility
 - Example) If the participant fails to provide a COVID-19 PCR test certificate on the date of arrival, or is delayed in arriving at the airport and fails to board the flight, any additional costs occurring thereof (flight change fees, etc.) is to be paid by the participant
- **Vaccination requirements** : participants are to individually check with the training institute on whether vaccination is required and prepare accordingly; any disadvantages following are the participant's own responsibility

- Example) If the participant fails to provide proof of a WHO-certified vaccination and cannot check into the university dormitory, the participant will be responsible to find accommodation for him/herself (accommodation fees are supported in the amount corresponding to the dormitory fees)
- **Check-in to Dormitory** : in principle, dormitory check-in is required of program participants
