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About the Organizer	Being a public institution under Department of Commerce, Xinjiang Uygur Autonomous Region, Xinjiang Center for Business Cooperation and Science & Technology Exchange “XinYuan” is mainly responsible for promoting economic and trade technology exchanges and cooperation, organizing enterprise personnel for economic and trade negotiations as well as coordination, organizing foreign personnel to conduct technical management exchange and training in China, and domestic personnel to conduct inspection and training abroad, as well as arrange forums. Approved by the Ministry of Commerce of the People's Republic of China, we have been responsible for the implementation of national foreign aid human resources development cooperation projects since 2007. Training content	I . Contents 1. Lectures (subject to change based on actual circumstances) (1) Studying Xi Jinping Economic Thought to Promote High-quality Economic Development: It systematically elaborates on the fundamental guarantee, fundamental stance, historical orientation, guiding principles, path options, distinctive theme, institutional foundation, strategic measures, primary driving force, key priorities, important magic weapon and vital safeguards for China’s economic development and fully demonstrates the theoretical logic and practical framework of economic work in the new era, helping participants systematically grasp the core essence of high-quality economic development in China. (2) Sharing on China’s National Conditions, Development Initiatives and Development Philosophies: It introduces basic knowledge of China’s national conditions and culture covering history, geography, society and economy, enabling participants to understand China’s political system and foreign policy, and comprehend mainstream social values and public ethics in China. (3) Current Situation and Trends of China’s AI Industry, Cross-border E-commerce and Mobile Payment: First, the development status of China’s AI industry; second, the current development and features of cross-border e-commerce and mobile payment in China; third, application scenarios and functions of AI in cross-border e-commerce livestreaming; fourth, development trends of the AI industry and cross-border e-commerce. (4) Progress, Difficulties and Countermeasures of China-Pakistan Digital Cooperation under the Framework of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC): First, the essence of China-Pakistan digital cooperation under CPEC; second, progress achieved in China-Pakistan digital cooperation under CPEC; third, difficulties facing China-Pakistan digital cooperation under	

CPEC; fourth, countermeasures for advancing China-Pakistan digital cooperation under CPEC.

(5) Digital Empowerment for Industrial and Commercial Cooperation — Experience of China's Digital Industry Development and New Opportunities for Cooperation under the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor: Centered on new models of industrial and commercial cooperation in the digital economy era, this course shares China's development experience in mobile payment, e-commerce, livestreaming, artificial intelligence and other fields. It analyzes pathways for digital technologies to advance industrial upgrading and the internationalization of enterprises. Combined with the development of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor, it explores new opportunities for both sides to deepen cooperation in digital industries and industrial and commercial sectors.

(6) Compliance and AI Customer Acquisition to Cut Costs and Boost Efficiency for China-Pakistan Business Cooperation: Centering on corporate compliance boundaries and new trends of AI-enabled digital customer acquisition and through case studies and interactive seminars, it helps participants systematically understand the logic of compliant business operations and master intelligent customer acquisition tools. This will facilitate the safe and efficient exploration of markets in both countries, strengthen economic and trade cooperation, and provide strong support for deepening China-Pakistan business cooperation.

(7) Policies and Practical Practices of China's Foreign Investment Promotion: First, China's policy framework for attracting foreign investment; second, practical guidance for foreign investment, including enterprise registration, investment and financing, taxation, and handling of legal disputes; third, key points for Pakistani enterprises investing in China; fourth, policy recommendations.

(8) Development of Characteristic Industries in China and China-Pakistan Cooperation in Characteristic Industries: Various regions across China have their unique characteristic industries, including cotton in Xinjiang, Chinese roses in Nanyang of Henan Province, flowers in Kunming of Yunnan Province, crayfish in Qianjiang of Hubei Province, and so on. These characteristic industries have made important contributions to local development across China and played a positive role in exports. At present, China is actively fostering a new development paradigm with domestic circulation as the mainstay and domestic and international circulations reinforcing each other, which further supports the development of characteristic industries. China and Pakistan are at complementary development stages and each have distinctive characteristic industries. The two sides can strengthen cooperation in the development of characteristic industries and expand the space for bilateral economic and trade cooperation between China and Pakistan.

(9) Opportunities and Challenges Brought by the Development of Cross-border E-commerce to Pakistan: First, the current development status of cross-border e-commerce; second, cross-border e-commerce platforms and ecosystems; third, opportunities brought by China's development to the economic and trade growth of Pakistan.

(10) Raising Your Lobster: OpenClaw from Basics to Application: It systematically illustrates the evolution of AI from chatbots to intelligent assistants and clarifies the core value of AI Agents before introducing four core capabilities of OpenClaw, namely multi-channel message integration, intelligent voice interaction, visual workspace and tool ecosystem. On this basis, typical cases are combined to demonstrate the application of OpenClaw in various scenarios. Finally, it elaborates on the local deployment process of OpenClaw, configuration methods for communication channels and large language model APIs, specifications for memory system setup, and principles for safe usage, helping participants quickly master OpenClaw and safely integrate it into daily workflows.

2. Cultural Experience

(1) It is planned to organize participants to visit local folk custom gathering places such as Urumqi Grand Bazaar, invite inheritors of intangible cultural heritage to demonstrate and let participants experience skills like embroidery and wood carving; arrange tasting of Xinjiang characteristic delicacies and folk interactions such as Xinjiang dances and folk songs to deepen the understanding of Xinjiang folk culture.

(2) It is planned to arrange participants to visit the Xinjiang Uygur Autonomous Region Museum to learn about Xinjiang's history and the course of ethnic integration, and strengthen the awareness of the Chinese nation community.

II. Visits (subject to change based on actual circumstances)

1. Participants are planned to visit fruit industry enterprises, Xinjiang Software Park and

Xinjiang Hechuang Meixin Technology Development Co., Ltd., enabling them to gain first-hand insights into Xinjiang's practical experience and cooperation opportunities in the whole industrial chain of characteristic forest fruits, the development of the digital economy, the construction of the Digital Silk Road, cross-border e-commerce and international trade.

2. Participants are proposed to embark on a study tour to Yiwu. As the world's largest distribution hub for small commodities, Yiwu serves as an ideal destination for countries including Pakistan and other South Asian nations to learn advanced experience in economic and trade cooperation and connect with the Chinese market. The seminar is expected to integrate theories covering small commodity international trade and cross-border e-commerce development with real-world practices in Yiwu. Ali, a Pakistani youth, established his company in Yiwu, becoming the 10,000th foreign-invested entity in the city and building a bridge for people-to-people business exchanges between China and Pakistan. The Yiwu Global Digital Trade Center regularly organizes procurement matchmaking events for Pakistani merchants, where the AI-powered "Digital Shopkeeper" provides intelligent services supporting switching between 36 languages. Certificates of Origin under the China-Pakistan Free Trade Agreement issued by Yiwu Customs have helped Pakistani enterprises save approximately 80 million Yuan in tariff costs in total. Empowered by its global trade network and digital technologies, Yiwu offers valuable references for Pakistan. It will help deepen understanding of cross-border e-commerce cooperation and supply chain management, and build momentum for industrial collaboration and practical cooperation in the digital economy under the framework of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor.
