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About the Organizer	The National Prosecutors College of P.R.China was established in 1991. It is directly affiliated with the Supreme People's Procuratorate of the People's Republic of China and serves as a specialized institution for training high-level, highly qualified prosecutors. The College and its 28 branch institutes are responsible at different levels for the training of procurators-general, prosecutors, and other prosecutorial auxiliary personnel at all levels. It also undertakes prosecutorial theoretical research and functions as a think tank. The College has two campuses: Shahe Campus in Changping District and Xiangshan Campus in Shijingshan District of Beijing, covering a total area of 380 mu. The two campuses provide training for about 16,000 participants annually on average. In recent years, the College has actively carried out online training for prosecutors and established the China Procuratorial Education Training Network Institute as a dedicated institution. The College prioritizes prosecutorial work, adheres to a practical, hands-on, and results-oriented approach, emphasizes the cultivation of judicial principles, and strives to enhance the political, professional, and ethical qualities of prosecutors. In accordance with training requirements and the characteristics of participants, the College adopts a diversified range of teaching methods to promote mutual learning between instructors and participants as well as among participants themselves, and continuously enhances the relevance and effectiveness of education and training. The College has a high-level teaching team composed of full-time, part-time, and specially engaged instructors, all with rich experience in judicial theory and practice. It has established high-level training platforms such as the "Great Prosecutor Lectures," the "Insight and Integrity in Prosecution Lectures," and the "Broad Prosecutorial Perspectives Lectures," providing participants with authoritative practical guidance and theoretical interpretation. The College places great emphasis on legal theory, particularly research on prosecutorial theory and practice, and is committed to fostering mutual reinforcement and coordinated development between teaching and research. The academic journals founded by the College, including the Journal of National Prosecutors College, The Chinese Procurators and Prosecution Review, play an active role in deepening research on prosecutorial theory, practice, and reform, and enjoy extensive influence in both academic and practical circles in China. The College also houses the China Prosecutorial Documentation Center, which collects procuratorial books, journals, chronicles, and yearbooks, and provides basic information services for prosecutorial research. The College serves as an important window for international exchanges in China's procuratorial academic field. The International Exchange Center for Prosecutors of the Supreme People's Procuratorate of China is located on the Xiangshan Campus of the College. Over the years, adhering to the philosophy of open education, the College has actively promoted international exchanges and cooperation in procuratorial education, training, and theoretical research by sending teachers abroad for academic exchanges, inviting foreign judicial counterparts to China for seminars, and conducting joint research on relevant topics, thus continuously enriching the connotation of friendly cooperation between Chinese and foreign procuratorial organs. The College has complete facilities and an elegant environment. In addition to modern teaching facilities, the College is equipped with a library, canteen, gymnasium, fitness center, clinic, and other supporting facilities to ensure the physical and mental health of participants	

	during training.
Training content	I. Main Training Content Core courses: The training is planned to be conducted through lectures, on-site teaching, visits and exchanges, as well as cultural exploration. Lectures: 1. Introduction to China's National Conditions; 2. Procuratorial system and reform in China; 3. Characteristics and practical development of China's procuratorial public interest litigation system; 4. Current status and challenging issues of telecommunications and online fraud crimes in China; 5. China's system and practice of international criminal judicial assistance. II. Visit Arrangements (Cities to be visited may be adjusted according to the actual situation) - On-site teaching and study visits: It is planned to organize participants to conduct field visits to China's four-level procuratorial organs in Beijing and Kunming. This will provide insights into the functions, operational highlights, and best practices of procuratorial bodies at different levels, as well as their practical experience in supporting and serving Chinese modernization in recent years. On-site teaching activities will focus on themes such as Digital Procuratorial Work, Juvenile Justice, Procuratorial Public Interest Litigation, Combating Telecommunications and Online Fraud, and Combating Drug Crimes. These activities are designed to facilitate face-to-face professional exchanges and mutual learning with Chinese counterparts. - Cultural exploration activities: Participants are scheduled to visit historical and cultural heritage sites in Beijing and Yunnan, experience traditional Chinese culture, observe local urban development and social customs, immerse themselves in the rich history of Chinese civilization, and gain a comprehensive, multi-dimensional, and authentic understanding of China. III. Lecturer Profile According to the training content, it is proposed to invite senior prosecutors from relevant departments of the Supreme People's Procuratorate of the People's Republic of China, senior professors from the National Prosecutors College of P.R.China, teachers from other well-known universities, chief prosecutors at Beijing and Yunnan procuratorates, as well as experts from other relevant departments, to undertake topic-specific lectures, on-site teaching tasks, or participate in experience exchanges for the seminar.
